I. Call to Order

Priorities for 2023: 1) Launch new TourTalbot.org website, 2) Continue to refine Digital First strategy for economic development and tourism, 3) Complete Visitors Center Feasibility Study, which has been funded by the Maryland Rural

Economic Development Fund, and 4) Pursue accommodations tax increase of 2%.

The new design capitalizes on the department's content strategy, and it will feature robust content about things to see and do in Talbot County. Ms. Bellis noted that the department should engage Tourism Board members and other partners to help expand the reach of the site.
